



## Replacing Your Mailbox Lock

Unfortunately, there's no master key, or any way to get a "replacement" key if you have lost the last of your existing mailbox keys.

You'll need to replace the lock itself, which will come with its own set of new keys.

You can purchase the below replacement lock/key set (or similar); the cost is only ~\$7.00.

This new lock can be simply clipped in place via the provided spring steel locking clip.

The new lock comes with 5 different cams; one of them will be the right one for your mailbox -- you'll need to select and attach the cam size which engages correctly with the mailbox frame.

You'll need to coordinate with the postal carrier though, so that you can access/remove the old lock from the inside while they have the whole panel open. Once you have the lock in hand, you can leave a note on the mailboxes for the carrier to alert you when they're here.

**NOTE:** The existing locks may be mounted via a spring clip, or by a hex nut that can be unscrewed. A small screwdriver and pliers will be helpful for the installation.
